CASE STUDIES

•Greece (2010 -...)

3 MoUs with the international creditors.

Starting point: Decentralized, fragmented and

(mainly) informal coordination MFA

Crisis: MF-led centralized, positive, and selective coordination



Starting point: Centralized coordination

with 3 main actors: MFA, MF and Office of the PM

Crisis: Economic Management Council: PM, vice PM, New Ministry

of Public Expenditure, MF





•Portugal (2011-2014)

Starting point: Centralized and selective MFA-led

coordination

Crisis: temporary task-force (ESAME) working with

the MF and the PM



Starting Point: No coordination mechanism

Crisis: specific coordination mechanism under the

supervision of the MF



Starting point: decentralized and comprehensive

Crisis: growing importance of the CIAE









Main Findings:

- 1) Adaptation of pre-existing models
- 2) **Temporary changes** at the domestic level
- 3) **Centralization** of EU coordination in domestic executives
